

Dear Friends,

This feels like a season of chapters, as we journey through a time of chapters ending and new chapters beginning.

In our liturgical season, we start June with the end of Eastertide, and begin a new chapter in the Church's calendar marked by Pentecost – the gift of the Holy Spirit's power to the faithful – and on into the new season of Trinity, as we celebrate knowing the fullness of our three-in-one God.

For the apostles and disciples in Jesus' time, it must have felt like a flurry of chapters ending and beginning too.

Jesus' crucifixion marked the end of one chapter, and then with the Resurrection they had a new chapter with Him.

Then, just as they are adjusting to this new time with Christ, He ascends to heaven and they have to start a new chapter without Him.

As they are filled with the Spirit, they have to work out how to be Church in this new way, under the leadership of their new shepherd, Peter.

With the opening of this new chapter, there also sadly comes the closing of another, as Morag, Jude and I prepare to move on to our new home in the Ashburton & Moorland Mission Community.

We will be moving on sometime in August, and I will be instituted in my new Mission Community on Wednesday 3rd September at St Andrew's Church, Ashburton, at 7pm.

Details of final services and farewells here will be forthcoming shortly.

Introducing...Rev'd Gill George

I am delighted to be writing this and am thoroughly looking forward to joining you in July.

Some of you will have met me on the pre-interview orientation day. Others will have seen me when you travelled to Rev Phill's (and my) ordination as priest – Okehampton was one of my curacy parishes.

I'm a Herefordshire farmer's daughter – eldest of 3, descended from generations of tenant farmers on both sides. I was the first in my family not to farm.

A child of the early 70s, I was a fan of Les Dawson, which made me request piano lessons for my 7th birthday. I also joined the village church choir and have sung or accompanied worship on the piano or organ ever since.

In my late teens I left and joined a pentecostal house church for a few years where I met and married Dave when I was 19, and we now have 3 grown-up children.

We came back to my home village church for a few years and then lived on site at Great Malvern Priory, Worcestershire, where Dave was Head Verger, and I was able to enjoy a beautiful choral music alongside leading a youth band introducing their own style of worship to the services, whilst studying sociology part time and bringing up the children.

In 2001 I spent two years auditing theology lectures whilst Dave (who is also a priest) trained for ministry in Oxford, and then did more sociology at Warwick University.

After graduation I worked in various community roles before becoming a building surveyor.

We have served in a wide variety of rural and urban parishes and church traditions.

Dave is from Devon, so we finally moved back down here in 2015, when he was appointed Vicar of Cockington, Torquay.

I had the privilege of ordination training on the rural ministry-focused pathway at Sarum (Salisbury), and my dissertation was on the role of historic rural church buildings in fostering faith, belonging and identity in the wider parish.

In February 2022 we moved to Okehampton for my curacy and Dave began prison chaplaincy.

I'm one of the Diocesan Spiritual Accompaniers, and in the Society of Catholic Priests.

So, what to expect? People tell me I'm an encouraging person. One of my greatest joys in ministry is identifying and supporting others to grow into their own callings.

I've been immersed in a wide variety of church service styles, and strongly feel it's important to take time to see what is already working in a place, and to build on that, rather than rush in with unnecessary change. A new person at the helm is a big change in itself initially, so my priority for the first six months will be to listen, hear what God is saying to individuals, church and community, and together we'll have a strong foundation for development and growth in the years ahead.

The money was split between The Royal British Legion and St. Mary's 'Heating and Seating' fund. A huge thank you to all the organisers.


May also brought the inaugural meeting of the Sydenham Damerel Parish Meeting.

Bell Tower Roof Progress

During July, the tower at St Andrew's will look a bit different. The Bell Tower Roof appeal has raised a substantial portion of the cost of the



repair. One challenge will be to ensure that the Tower is kept dry while he repair work is carried out. A planning meeting was held in May with the contractors to discuss the extent and design of scaffolding required. This will largely determine the eventual cost of the project.

To keep the Tower dry during the work a pond liner will be laid on the timber and a tarpaulin will be

suspended from the scaffolding about the level of the parapet. The plan is to carry out the work in July.





NATURE NOTES BY BLUEBELL

"Shall I compare thee to a summer's day?
Thou art more lovely and more temperate.
Rough winds do shake the darling buds of May,
And summer's lease hath all too short a date."

May this year has produced a wonderful show of white hawthorn or May blossom trees. The spring weather dictates the abundance and luxuriance of this blossom, as painted recently by David Hockney.

"The risen cream of all the milkiness of May-time" H. E Bates.

Many miles of hawthorn hedges were planted in the great parliamentary land enclosures of the eighteenth and nineteenth

centuries.

Before that they stood alone or in small clumps and landmarks. It was thought unlucky to bring May blossom into the house. The blossoming of the May tree marks the cusp between Spring and Summer. Their thorns give small birds protection from the sparrow hawk, and the haws or fruit give food in the autumn.

Bees

Suddenly Bluebell heard a strange roaring noise almost as if floods of water were pouring through the grass down the hill toward her, but there was no water there! Only a very small stream. As she drew closer the roaring noise grew louder. She looked up and then she saw... the noise was caused by a swarm of hundreds of bees, dark against the blue sky, a few feet above her.



It was late May, "A swarm of bees in May, is worth a stack of hay, a swarm of bees in June is worth a silver spoon, but a swarm in July is not worth a fly." They had disappeared this winter. Normally opportunists, they fly on fine winter days looking for the few opening flowers, but not this year. Bluebell was afraid that they may have died of a bee disease, or been poisoned by farm insecticides, neonicotinoids. Now Bluebell was delighted to see them returning to the hole in the big ash tree where they have had a hive or nest for the last few years. They are wild black English honey bees.

The swifts are back, too, but sadly no swallows to their old nesting sites in the porch.

The fawn was lying in the bracken, perfectly still, silent and scentless. Bluebell left quietly and quickly, putting the dogs on leads. The mother would return soon, to nurse her baby. Its safety lay in its absolute stillness.

What a wonderful sunny time in the garden.

By the time you read this it may have changed, but we have been very blessed.

Sometimes though it has been a bit too hot and dry for seedlings but we shouldn't

complain because the slugs have been hiding; waiting for proper Devon weather.

My tomatoes - grown from seed - are coming on fine; the only real problem being that I sowed several types, put labels in the pots, put them carefully on a window sill.

Little did I expect that the cat would knock them flying onto the floor scattering the labels at random!

Rhododendrons have been brilliant this year. The photo (top right) shows one of my favourites. This is really beautiful when in full flower. Many years it gets hit by rain and wind and doesn't flower so long.



The hedgerows have been magnificent too. One that really struck me is the road down

to Bere Ferrers; awash with colours.

Red Campion is really nice - see the photo (middle left). This looks good in a vase with some other flowers from the garden or hedgerows.

Cow Parsley, Fox Gloves? Let's face it, there are hundreds of beautiful wild flowers.

Now, do foxes really wear gloves? Well, let them grow and seed but beware the foliage can be poisonous.

And Cow Parsley - also known as Queen Anne's Lace - is harmless, but others can be mistaken for it. Hemlock and Fool's Parsley for example can be mistaken for Cow Parsley and both are poisonous.

COULD THIS BE YOU?


At the recent meeting of the Benefice Pastoral Care Team on the 24th June, it was agreed that we should run a locally based Anna Friends Training Course in October. With Rev. Andy leaving and Rev. Phill holding the fort with support from Tim Thompson and Richard Searight, there was a recognition that many of our older folk, who can longer physically attend our church services, should be supported as much as possible by our local lay people. Anna Friends work alongside Anna Chaplains (Annie Jefferies and Josie Whitfield) to offer varying degrees of spiritual support. This might be personal visits to people's home, telephone support or taking worship services in care homes.

All six of our churches have parishioners in their later years and when falls or illness make people housebound, we should have a flexible team who can visit these people at home. It would therefore be ideal to have one or two people from each church who might consider doing the Anna Friends course which is done over three training sessions of two hours each.

The course will cover:-

- what it means to be a good and focused listener
- the ageing process, grief and loss
- what is dementia and how can we meaningfully engage with individuals and their families
- how to select helpful Bible readings
- writing simple prayers
- offering people Holy Communion at home






